One of the main areas of focus for transfer students is the WSU **General Education Requirements.** These are classes in addition to courses within your major that are required to ensure fundamental skills and a well-rounded education. There are two ways that transfer students can meet these requirements:

## Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA)

## **Direct Course Equivalencies for each category**

- If you do not have an MTA endorsement, you can transfer the courses below to meet each requirement.
- Choose one from each category except for the Natural Scientific Inquiry, which requires two courses.
- Courses with an **asterisk (\*)** fall under more than one category, but these courses will fulfill only <u>one</u> category that would benefit the student most.
- Courses below may be part of the major requirements. See under Major Requirements on page 2.
