

This transfer plan will help guide you in making the transition from community college to Wayne State University. <u>WSU</u>
<u>strongly recommend that all transfer students to meet with a WSU advisor to ensure you are taking the correct courses before transferring</u>. Here are the advisor contact information to set up an appointment:

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One of the main areas of focus for transfer students is the WSU **General Education Requirements.** These are classes in addition to courses within your major that are required to ensure fundamental skills and a well-rounded education. There are two ways that transfer students can meet these requirements:

Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA)

Direct Course Equivalencies for each category

- If you do not have an MTA endorsement, you can transfer the courses below to meet each requirement.
- Choose **one** from each category **except** for the Natural Scientific Inquiry, which requires **two** courses.
- Courses with an asterisk (*) fall under more than one category, but these courses will fulfill only <u>one</u> category that would benefit the student most.
