

Transfer Plan for Southwestern Michigan College **Social Work—B.S.W Degree** School of Social Work **socialwork.wayne.edu/** (313) 577-4409

One of the main areas of focus for transfer students is the WSU **General Education Requirements**, which are classes in addition to courses within your major that are required to ensure fundamental skills and a well-rounded education. We strongly recommend that all transfer students fulfill their general education requirements through the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) before transferring to WSU.

Transfer Timeline:

- Before transferring to WSU: Complete up to 64 credits of course work at Southwestern (see the table under "WSU's General Education + B.S.W Pre-Professional Requirements")
- After transferring to WSU: Complete remaining 51 credits of B.S.W. professional coursework of which 49 credits in fieldwork and field-related courses.
- Electives are available to complete the required **minimum of 120 credits** for graduating with a Bachelor's of Social Work (B.S.W) degree.

WSU's General Education + B.S.W Pre-Professional Requirements:

Students interested in pursuing a B.S.W at WSU may take <u>one course from each category below</u> at your community college before transferring to WSU. By doing so, they will be able to fulfill the MTA requirement, which fulfills WSU's General Education Requirements AND the Pre-professional requirements for the Bachelor's of Social Work (B.S.W) degree.
